

Recent Works of Steve Lotz

After being raised in California and educated at UCLA, the University of Florida, and the school of Fine Arts in Vienna, Austria, Steve Lotz settled in Orlando FL. in 1969. He joined the charter faculty at UCF (then FTU) and chaired its Art Department during the university's formative first ten years. During his 35 year professorship he also taught on exchanges with the Edinburgh, Scotland, College of Art. He maintains studios in Orlando and Boone, NC.

Lotz is well known for metaphorical paintings of sensuous, unfolding biomorphic forms and figures and lush, tropical landscapes. Through his search for a meaning to life and a centering of his soul expressed through art, Mr. Lotz has gone through many stages in his creations. Even though it has often been an unconscious effort, all of his art work seems to have had an underlying theme, that of creating art that is metaphorical of an eternal backing to life.

His paintings can be found in the collections of the Cummer Gallery of Art, Jacksonville; HRH Prince Phillip, London; The Cornell Museum, Winter Park; The Jacksonville Art Museum; General Telephone Co., Tampa; Walt Disney World; Florida State Solar Energy Center, Merritt Island; Universal Studios, Florida; Orlando International Airport; Barnett Bank, Jacksonville; the University of Central Florida; and the Alachua County Public Library, Gainesville. He has had over fifty one-man exhibitions in this country and in Hamburg, Stuttgart, Paris, and Basel.

Art in the Chambers
