The Charles Hosmer Morse Museum of American Art houses the world's most comprehensive collection of the works of [Louis Comfort Tiffany](#) (1848-1933), the scope of which includes Tiffany jewelry, pottery, paintings, art glass, leaded-glass windows, lamps and the chapel interior he designed for the 1893 World's Columbian Exposition in Chicago. The museum was funded in 1942 on the campus of Rollins College by Jeanette McKean. In 1995 the museum moved to its current location.

In its galleries, the museum also features a major collection of American art pottery and representative collections of late-19th and early-20th century American painting, graphics and decorative art.

In 1995 the McKean's rescued architectural element, furniture and windows from Laurelton Hall, Louis Comfort Tiffany's Long Island estate. Over a period of almost 50 years the couple assembled extensive holdings, in fact, the world's most comprehensive collections of Louis Comfort Tiffany's work.

The founders were Jeannette and Hugh McKean and that they spent nearly 50 years assembling the extensive Tiffany holdings of the museum.
