## Orange County Code

Orange County Code, Chapter 5 protects the rights of citizens and animals. It is a violation to:

- Not have a current rabies certificate for your dog or cat
- Allow your dog to run loose
- Allow your animal to bother neighbors
- Allow your animal to chase cars, other animals or people
- Allow your animal to bark or make noises that pose a nuisance to neighbors
- Allow your animal to destroy people's property
- Abandon any animal
- Neglect any animal
- Allow your animal to bite a human
- Allow a quarantined animal to run loose
- Trap without permission from Orange County Animal Services
- Interfere with an Animal Services Officer

## Citations

Citations are issued for any violations listed above. Fines range from \$75.00 to over \$500.00 for the first violation. A Responsible Pet Education Class is required for Category I & II violations. If offered, the class may be taken in place of a fine for a first time Category III violation. Citations are paid to the Clerk of Courts.

## Impound Information

If your animal is missing or you have a notice of impound, please come immediately to Animal Services to reclaim your pet.

Animal Services holds animals for a minimum of five (5) working days. You must show identification and a rabies vaccination record (if no health record is available, a rabies vaccination will be provided for \$5.00). All shelter and medical fees must be paid before the animal is returned to owner.

- First time impoundment \$15.00
- Second impoundment \$25.00
- Third impoundment \$40.00
- Daily board fee \$10.00

## About Animal Services

Orange County Animal Services is one of Central Florida's largest Pet Rescue and Adoption Centers. Each year we receive close to 18,000 animals at our shelter.

Our mission is to protect the health, safety, and general welfare of Orange County citizens and animals through effective and courteous enforcement and education of Orange County laws and codes.

Our vision is to give abandoned and neglected pets a second chance to live a long and healthy life, in a safe loving home.

Animal Services offers many programs; here are some ways in which we serve the citizens of Orange County:

- Help control pet overpopulation by providing affordable spay and neuter services.
- Respond to: nuisance, bite, cruelty, and animal complaint calls.

- Offer volunteer opportunities to individuals and families.

## Adoptions

Pets can be a wonderful addition to your life. If you are thinking about getting a pet, please consider adopting from a shelter. Shelter pets make wonderful lifetime companions, and you will be saving the life of an abandoned or neglected animal.

All animals at our shelter were impounded and not reclaimed by their owner, or they were turned into us by people who could no longer care for them.

Adoption rates:

Cats or Kittens	\$40.00
Dogs or Puppies	\$55.00
Ferret	\$40.00
Other Animals	\$15.00

The adoption fee includes:

- Spay or Neuter.
- Up-to-date vaccines for dogs and cats.
- Dogs over six months are tested for Heartworms.
- All cats are tested for Feline Leukemia and Aids.
- Pets three months or older receive the initial rabies vaccine.
- All dogs and cats are micro chipped (implant device used for identification).



## Spay & Neuter Program

Orange County Animal Services provides low cost spay and neuter surgery for residents of Orange County. For an appointment call (407) 254-9140.

Spaying or neutering is surgically altering animals so that they cannot reproduce. Why should you spay or neuter your pet?

- ✓ Spaying and neutering increases your pet's chances for a longer, healthier life.
- ✓ Neutered males are less aggressive and are not distracted by females in heat.
- ✓ Spaying and neutering helps alleviate the dog and cat overpopulation problem.

If you are on a reduced income and receive Medicaid assistance your pets may qualify for free spay and neuter services.
