18	WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 327.46, Florida Statutes, Orange County has the authority to establish boating-restricted areas, including idle speed, no wake boating-restricted areas and
20	vessel-exclusion zones; and
22	WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners finds it to be in the interest of public health, safety, and welfare to designate the boating-restricted areas set forth herein.

	Section 1. Amendments; In General. Article II, Chapter 8, of the Orange County

	ARTICLE II. BOATS
32	Sec. 8-26. Authority; scope.
34	(a) This article is adopted pursuant to the county's home rule authority to adopt ordinances to protect the health, safety and

general welfare of the citizens of the county, and further, pursuant to <u>Sections 327.46 and 327.60</u>, <u>Florida Statutes</u>F.S. § 327.60.

- (b) Boats having been declared dangerous instrumentalities pursuant to F.S. § Section 327.32, Florida Statutes, the board of county commissioners hereby determines that the following rules and regulations are necessary in order to protect the health, safety and general welfare of the citizens of the county using the waterways of the county.
- (c) This article shall apply to all waterways in the unincorporated and incorporated area of the county, unless exempted by general or special law or preempted by municipal ordinance.
- (d) Nothing herein shall limit the authority of the board of county commissioners or mayor to issue an emergency ordinance or order addressing vessel operation following the occurrence of a natural, technological, or manmade emergency within the county.
- (d) This article shall not apply to boats, motorboats or skiers performing in or used in shows, exhibitions or tournaments operated by and at a theme park or other amusement park. The operators of the theme park or amusement park shall be responsible for the safe operation and equipping of all boats, motorboats and skiers at such shows, exhibitions or tournaments.

Sec. 8-27. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning. If any definition is inconsistent with the definition in Section 327.02, Florida Statutes, the definition in Section 327.02, Florida Statutes, shall take precedence:

<u>Boating-restricted area</u> means an area of the waters of the state within which the operation of vessels is subject to specified restrictions or from which vessels are excluded.

Idle speed, no wake means that a vessel must proceed at a speed no greater than that which will maintain steerageway and headway. At no time is any vessel required to proceed so slowly that the operator is unable to maintain control over the vessel or any other vessel or object that it has under tow.

Boats shall mean all rafts, skiffs, dredges, canoes, dugouts, dinghies, rowboats, sailboats and motorboats. Sailboards are specifically excluded from this definition.

Motorboats shall mean any boat that is propelled or powered by any internal or external combustion engine or motor.

Operate means to be in charge of, in command of, or in actual physical control of a vessel upon the waters of the state, to exercise control over or to have responsibility for a vessel's navigation or safety while the vessel is underway upon the waters of the state, or to control or steer a vessel being towed by another vessel upon the waters of the state.

Operator shall mean any person in charge of or having immediate control over a boat, whether such person is the owner of the boat, or a permitted or an unauthorized user of the boat. means any person in charge of, in command of, or in actual physical control of a vessel upon the waters of the state, exercising control over or having responsibility for a vessel's navigation or safety while the vessel is underway upon the waters of the state, or controlling or steering a vessel being towed by another vessel upon the waters of the state.

Owner means a person, other than a lienholder, having the property in or title to a vessel. The term includes a person entitled to the use or possession of a vessel subject to an interest in another person which is reserved or created by agreement and securing payment of performance of an obligation. The term does not include a lessee under a lease not intended as security.

<u>Person</u> means an individual, partnership, firm, corporation, association, or other entity.

<u>Vessel</u> is synonymous with boat as referenced in s. 1(b), Art. VII of the State Constitution and includes every description of watercraft, barge, and airboat, other than a seaplane on the water, used or capable of being used as a means of transportation on water.

<u>Vessel-exclusion zone</u> means an area from which all vessels or certain classes of vessels are excluded.

Waters of the state means any navigable waters of the United States within the territorial limits of the state of Florida, the marginal sea adjacent to the state of Florida and the high seas when navigated as a part of a journey or ride to or from the shore of the state of Florida, and all the inland lakes, rivers, and canals under the jurisdiction of the state of Florida.

Waterway shall—means any waters, lakes, canals, streams, lagoons or connecting waters, whether natural or manmade, partially or wholly within the boundaries of the county.
