History of the Program

The Elder Ambassador program is a volunteer outreach effort focused on increasing awareness of elder services and opportunities in Central Florida. It was developed because elder services professionals recognized the knowledge gap that often exists among local residents with many unaware of who to contact for elder services, or where to go to participate in active-aging programming.

This Commission on Aging program addresses this challenge by working with residents dedicated to making Central Florida an elder-friendly community. These local volunteers attend a 3-day core training, periodic training updates, and are provided with educational resources to share with their neighbors, family, and friends.

Through this team of community volunteers, it is hoped that more elders, their caregivers and their families can better connect to resources in Central Florida.

Types of Educational Outreach

Elder Ambassador volunteers share their knowledge by:

- Providing free seminars to faith, civic, homeowner's and other community groups
- Participate as vendors at local resource fairs
- Disseminate resources in the community

New educational seminars are developed 3 to 4 times per year! So check back often to learn what aging topics are offered through this series.
