Rio Grande Avenue Pedestrian Safety Study Virtual Community Meeting

Orange County conducted a Pedestrian Safety Study on Rio Grande Avenue from Holden Avenue to Jones High School, approximately 2.7 miles. The study was conducted to develop alternatives and strategies to address the mobility needs of the surrounding community and provide safer integration of pedestrians and bicyclists with other modes of transportation.

A virtual community meeting is being held to present the study findings and recommendations for Rio Grande Avenue. During the virtual community meeting, the public will have the opportunity to ask questions and provide comments to Orange County and the project team.
