PUBLIC NOTICE SECOND SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT TO 2019-2020 ONE-YEAR ACTION PLAN

Notice is hereby given that, in accordance with 24 CFR 91.105(c)(2) of the federal regulations relative to citizen participation for Community Planning and Development Programs and applicable waivers made available to those requirements through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, which was signed into law on March 27, 2020, Orange County is making a second substantial amendment to the 2019-2020 One-Year Action Plan available to the public through this notice. The Action Plan is a component of the 2016-2020 Orange County Consolidated Plan, a strategic plan covering five federal fiscal years that identifies the County's housing and community development objectives and priorities. The proposed amendment is available for a 7-day public review and comment period from March 29, 2021 through April 5, 2021.

This amendment will enable the County to receive and administer additional funding from Department of Housing and Community Development (HUD). The second substantial amendment to the 2019-2020 One-Year Action Plan incorporates supplemental funding received under the CARES Act and outlines a list of activities to be undertaken with those funds to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the COVID-19 pandemic. The proposed budget for the second substantial amendment includes funding from the supplemental Community Development Block Grant (CDBG-CV3) Program for the sum of \$8,156,612, and from the supplemental Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG-CV2) for the sum of \$5,016,437, as well as the projects and activities that will be implemented using these funds. A list of proposed activities to be funded with the additional funds is provided below.
