## ORANGE COUNTY, FLORIDA EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2024-03 REGARDING HURRICANE MILTON

**Date:** October 15, 2024 **Time:** 9/18 A.M.

**WHEREAS**, on October 7, 2024, I issued Emergency Executive Order 2024-02 ordering a State of Local Emergency due to the threat posed by Hurricane Milton; and

WHEREAS, no State of Local Emergency declared pursuant to the Florida Emergency Management Act may continue for more than seven (7) days, unless renewed; and

**WHEREAS**, in the aftermath of Hurricane Milton, there continues to be a threat to the health, safety, welfare and property of the people of Orange County.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Jerry L. Demings, County Mayor of Orange County, Florida, acting as the Director of Emergency Management, promulgate the following Emergency Executive Order, to take immediate effect:

- 1. The State of Local Emergency declared in Emergency Executive Order 2024-02, is hereby reinstituted and extended for seven (7) days from the date and time hereof, and may be further extended in seven (7) day increments or less, as necessary, pursuant to Section 252.38(3)(a)5, Florida Statutes.
- 2. Except as amended herein, Emergency Executive Order 2024-02 is ratified and reaffirmed.
