DRAFT Substantial Amendment to FY 2025-2026 Annual Action Plan Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP-3)

Summary of the proposed changes

Orange County, FL receives federal funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) through the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME) Program, and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG). The primary objective of the CDBG program is the development of viable urban communities by providing decent housing, a suitable living environment and expanding economic opportunities for persons of low- to moderate-income. The primary objective of the HOME program is the provision of decent affordable housing to low-income households and leveraging efforts to preserve and expand affordable housing stock. The primary objective of the ESG program is the provision of housing stabilization and services to homeless individuals and families.

As a recipient of federal funds, the County is required to develop an Annual Action Plan that identifies specific activities that Orange County intends to pursue through the CDBG, HOME, ESG, and other state and local housing and community development programs, to address the objectives identified in the 2022-2026 Orange County Consolidated Plan. The FY 2025-2026 Action Plan covers the period starting October 1, 2025, through September 30, 2026, and it was approved by the Board of County Commissioners on August 5, 2025.

The Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP) was created by the Housing Economic Recovery Act of 2008 to respond to the rising residential foreclosures and property abandonment, and to stabilize communities negatively impacted by foreclosures. Orange County received two allocations of NSP funds (NSP-1 and NSP-3) that were used for the following activities: 1) acquire, rehabilitate, and re-sell foreclosed homes to income-qualified buyers; 2) provide financial incentives to homebuyers of foreclosed homes; 3) acquire and rehabilitate foreclosed multifamily housing. The County is currently in the process of closing out both of the NSP programs, in accordance with HUD requirements and guidance.

The Orange County Citizen Participation Plan, which was last updated in November of 2023, requires a substantial amendment to an approved Action Plan when there is a change that adds a new activity. The Federal Register Notice (FR-5933-N-01), which was published on June 14, 2016, revised requirements and the treatment of the NSP program income for all three rounds of allocations; it allows NSP program income received by a CDBG recipient to be transferred from the NSP program to the CDBG program. After the transfer is carried out, any transferred program income is subject to the CDBG program income regulations.

In accordance with requirements of the Citizen Participation Plan and 24 CFR Part 91.505, the County is submitting a substantial amendment to its FY 2025-2026 Annual Action Plan to transfer the program income from the NSP-3 Program, in the amount of **\$589,930.22**, to the CDBG program. The re-allocated funds will be expended on the CDBG-eligible activities to address the needs, priorities and goals identified in the 2022-2026 Orange County Consolidated Plan.

2. Summarize the objectives and outcomes identified in the Plan

The County is currently in the process on closing out both of the NSP programs, in accordance with HUD requirements and guidance. After the transfer is carried out, any transferred program income will be subject to the CDBG program income regulations.

In accordance with requirements of the Citizen Participation Plan and 24 CFR Part 91.505, the County is submitting a substantial amendment to its FY 2025-2026 Annual Action Plan to transfer of program income the NSP-3 Program, in the amount of **\$589,930.22**, to the CDBG program. The re-allocated funds will be expended on the CDBG-eligible activities to address the needs, priorities and goals identified in the 2022-2026 Orange County Consolidated Plan.

4. Summary of Citizen Participation Process and consultation process

To comply with requirements of the Citizen Participation Plan, the County will post a public notice summarizing the proposed changes and noting a 30-day review and comment period on its website and in a newspaper of general circulation. Upon request, the County will also make copies of the proposed substantial amendment available to citizens and groups. All comments received in writing during the established public comment period will be considered in preparing the final substantial amendment. A summary of any accepted comments or views, and a summary of any comments or views not accepted and the reasons for, will be attached to the substantial amendment. Upon conclusion of the public comment period, the substantial amendment must be submitted to the Board of County Commissioners for approval, and then submitted to HUD through the IDIS for the final approval.

The public comment period for the proposed amendment begins on December 1, 2025, and will end on December 30, 2025.
